




**POLICY ANALYSIS** IGC Growth Framework: A Framework for **Productivity and Export-led Growth in Pakistan** This month's policy Analysis section features a Growth Framework jointly developed by International Growth Centre (IGC) and CDPR, at the request of Pakistan's Planning Commission. The Framework outlines a roadmap to revitalise Pakistan's economy by boosting productivity and promoting export-led growth. This framework places productive job creation at the heart of Pakistan's growth strategy and explores interventions to enhance productivity and competitiveness through interventions on increasing export-led competitiveness and tax and regulatory reforms, Synchronisation of State-Owned Enterprises (SOE) and Foreign Direct Investment (FDI). Focusing on Climate-aligned trade and energy policies, greener agriculture and industrial policy and specifically on women's economic


